

Roblox Child Account Setup & Lockdown Guide for Families



This guide will help you create a safe Roblox environment for your child with parental control over communication, purchases, content, and screen time.

◆ Step 1: Create Two Roblox Accounts

You'll need two accounts:

1. Your child's account – used by your child to play.
2. Your parent account – used by you to manage and monitor.

A. Set up your child's account:

- Go to [roblox.com](https://www.roblox.com) or use the Roblox mobile app.
- Choose a secure username and a strong password.
- Enter your child's real birthdate – this ensures Roblox automatically applies default safety settings for under-13s.

⚠ Do NOT enter your own birthdate on your child's account – this will bypass critical safety protections.

B. Set up your own parent account:

- Create a second Roblox account using your real birthdate.
- Once signed in, go to Settings > Parental Controls and follow the prompt to verify your age (using an ID or credit card).

◆ Step 2: Link Your Accounts

Linking your Parent and Child accounts:

1. Sign into your parent account.
2. Ask your child to sign into theirs.
3. On your child's account:
 - Go to Settings > Parental Controls > Add Parent.
4. Follow the on-screen instructions to verify your age and agree to link accounts.

Once linked, you can manage everything remotely from your parent account.

◆ Step 3: Lock Down Communication Settings

Turn off all chat options:

1. Go to your parent account.
2. Navigate to Settings > Parental Controls > Settings You Manage > Communication.
3. Adjust these:
 - Experience Chat: Set to No One
 - Experience Direct Chat (/w command): Set to No One
 - Party Chat (1:1 or Group): Set both to No One

💡 These settings prevent chatting with strangers inside games and block group messages.

◆ Step 4: Set Content Restrictions


Filter for age-appropriate experiences:

1. In your parent account, go to:
 - Settings > Parental Controls > Settings You Manage > Content Restrictions
2. Choose Content Maturity:
 - For young children, select Minimal or Mild.
3. Use Blocked Experiences to prevent access to specific games:
 - Add any known problematic games by name.

◆ Step 5: Set Spending Limits & Notifications

Set a monthly spend cap:

1. In your parent account:
 - Go to Settings > Parental Controls > Settings You Manage > Spending Restrictions.
2. Choose:
 - Monthly Spending Limit – set to £0 or your preferred limit.
 - Spending Notifications – set to All Transactions for total visibility.

 You'll get notified if your child tries to make large purchases or uses Robux unexpectedly.

◆ Step 6: Set Daily Screen Time Limits

1. In your parent account:
 - Go to Settings > Parental Controls > Screen Time.
2. Set a daily limit using the dropdown (e.g. 1 hour per day).
3. Monitor your child's usage from the Top Experiences tab.

◆ Step 7: Monitor and Manage the Friends List

1. Go to:
 - Settings > Parental Controls > Friends > Manage.
2. View your child's friend list and block/report users if needed.



If someone's bothering your child, you can remove and block them instantly.

◆ Step 8: Review Private Servers Access

1. Navigate to Parental Controls > Visibility & Private Servers.
2. Set Private Servers to Friends only or Off for tight control.



Bonus Tip: Stay Informed as They Grow

Roblox loosens restrictions as your child ages:

- At 13: They gain more access to chat, friends, and privacy settings.
- At 18: Your account is automatically unlinked.



You'll be notified by Roblox at ages 9, 13, and 18 of these changes.
